




Classical Festival 2022 "Yaad-e-Salamat"




25th ALHAMRA THEATRE FESTIVAL

At Alhamra Art Gallery



SUMBAL TREE

This tree, aged 110 years, is located at Lawrence Garden, Lahore. Anna Molka Ahmad (1917 - 1995), an old master, captured it on canvas in 1952, using her signature impasto technique. Ahmad has painted it using a warm color palette of humid tropical climate. At first sight, it is a typical sight of a garden. The tree is a focal point that leads eye movement towards branches and leaves. At a closer look, you can also see three gardeners working in Scape using tools/ machinery. There is also a long puddle. In other words, the artist has focused on nature, providing shelter, food and profession to humankind. This painting is currently hung at Alhamra Art Museum and is a significant visual treat for art lovers.
