
Hajj Draw

Ahmad Zoay (1947 – 10 July 2014) was a Pakistani painter and sculptor. He was born in Ludhiana, Punjab, in prepartition India in 1947. His family migrated to Walton, Lahore in the newly created Pakistan after partition. Zoay took admission in the National College of Arts, Lahore in 1969 but did not complete his degree. From there began his journey into the world of art. He travelled to many countries after that and was introduced to the then prevalent 'Hippie culture' which is reflected in his works and life. Known for paintings with psychedelic intensity his canvasses are replete with primary colours, red, yellow, green and blue. Zoay's artistic rejection of manmade political boundaries showed in the symbolism in his paintings of a multi-cultural, multi-religious Indian sub-continent of past times.
